Department faculty and Forman Sociology Society have remained committed to organizing activities and workshops to promote community service and skill building for research, and students have also been suporting faculty research projects and data collection. We also held ceremonies to award students with certificates for serving as thesis class reps and as research assistants for the NRPU HEC project (*pictures below*). Finally, our biggest source of pride has been news from our alumni, showing how advantageous a sociology degree is in pursuing and succeeding in diverse professions including Punjab Police; Editorial work for a Social Science Journal; Environmental, social, and corporate governance; and Product management.



DEPARTMENT CONFERENCE

The Department of Sociology held its 5th Conference on Marginalized Populations on 29th November, 2023. The conference covered three major themes: 1. Religious Minorities and Exclusion: The Christians, Hindus, and Hazara Shias of Pakistan; 2. Health Seeking Barriers and Patient Safety: Low statues healthcare providers, refugee patients and aging women of Pakistan; and 3. 



Workshop on Proposal Writing

The Sociology Department arranged a workshop on 9th August '23 on proposal writing for Undergraduate students. **Ms. Syeda Amna Hassan** conducted the session. Her experience as a Lecturer at the Information Technology University, Lahore, Pakistan, and as an administrator and researcher at Safer Society for Children (a child sexual abuse prevention program) made her session valuable for students and attendees.

Moreover, Ms. Hassan shared key tips on how to win grants through proposal writing, based on her winning proposal with National Geographic, which looks at the human cost of high-altitude snow avalanches and glacial lake outburst floods (GLOFs) in Northern Pakistan.



Workshop on writing a M&E Report

The Department of Sociology held a workshop to train students on how to write a Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) Report, based on industry demand (15TH May 2023). The aim was to support students and other participants to build their skill-set and gain better opportunities for job placements and professional advancement. A total of 41 participants attended the workshop, which was conducted by **Dr. Sara Rizvi Jafree** (Associate Professor, Department of Sociology). Awareness Posters to reduce Gender Inequality



Thank you Dr Julie Flowerday



NRPU HEC Grant Update

Dr Sara Rizvi Jafree (Associate Professor, Department of Sociology) has completed one part of the NRPU HEC project ("Evidence based Intevention to improve Social Policy for Maternal and Child Health"), with her team (faculty and student research assistants). The project involved a community needs assessment and found that primary health services for maternal and child health are adversely affected by: (i) poor housing quality & sanitation; (ii) inadequate food supply & safety; (iii) unsatisfactory public sector school services; (iv) lack of safety and security; (v) scarce poverty alleviation efforts & loan schemes; (vi) unsatisfactory transport & internet services; and (vii) inadequate health services. The study recommends close coordination between the primary health sector, local governance, and macro state structures, which collectively must monitor and improve housing adequacy, food security, public sector services (primary healthcare services, public schooling, public transport, and public internet access), overall safety, and poverty emergence. Research on Afghan Families seeking Healthcare

Ms. Tehniyat Fatima (Lecturer, Department of Sociology) presented the preliminary findings of her ongoing research titled "Challenges faced by Afghan Cancer Patients' Attendants in Pakistan" at the 5th Conference on Marginalized Populations, on 29th November '23.

Her talk highlighted the issues that medical tourists from Afghanistan face in navigating the health system in Pakistan, particularly for cancer treatment and helped to create awareness about medical tourism in Pakistan and the support minority and visiting groups need while seeking health services in the country.


