


 PROCEEDINGS OF 1ST VIRTUAL INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE




The Population Research Center (PRC) conducted its 1st virtual international conference/panel discussion via zoom on December 2nd, 2021. The day-long event was titled "Opportunities and threats: Population growth and the way ahead". The event consisted of two sessions. The first session was panel discussion in which national and international panelists presented on the central theme of the panel discussion which was "the relationship between population growth and socioeconomic and political development by reviewing and assessing the challenges and opportunities, in order to design the strategies for overcoming population growth related issues." While in the second session, participants from different academic backgrounds presented their research papers. The papers were reviewed and shortlisted by the editorial board.

In this regard, PRC team transcribed, edited and finalized the proceedings of conference in the shape of booklet. The booklet contains presentations of the national and international panelists and academic conference papers presented by paper presenters. The conference booklet is in the process of printing and will be disseminated soon.


PUBLICATION OF PRC's CONFERENCE BOOKLET

About the Event

PRC organized a webinar on "Evaluation of Maternal and Child Week Program: Findings from Pakistan" on May 17th, 2022. The guest speaker of the event was Dr. Rubeena Zakar, Dr. Rubeena talked on Evaluation of Maternal and Child Week Program: Findings from Pakistan. MCW is about to bring a positive change in the health of mothers and children in Pakistan. Several international organizations, including UNICEF, are playing a significant role especially in areas that lack basic health services. To support efforts to translate Pakistan's National Health Vision into action, UNICEF developed a Mother and Child Health Week (MCW) Strategy which aims to help the Government to deliver maternal and child health services to communities' doorsteps.

UNICEF supported the first evaluation of the Mother and Child Week (MCW) initiative to identify lessons learned and provide evidence for improved programme design, implementation and evidence-based decision-making on maternal, neonatal and child health (MNCH) in Pakistan. The Evaluation was conducted by Prof. Dr. Rubeena Zakar, Director Institute of Social and Cultural Studies and her team. The evaluation provided evidence that the MCW initiative was successful in achieving its intended objectives of strengthening the delivery of routine MNCH services, while improving access to services for marginalized, crisis and disasteraffected populations.



About the Speaker

Dr. Rubeena Zakar is currently a professor of Public Health and Director of the Institute of Social and Cultural Studies, University of the Punjab, Lahore, Pakistan. She did her Ph.D. in Public Health from Bielefeld University, Germany (2012) with distinction (Summa cum laude).

She was also associated as a researcher in the Department of Public Health Medicine, Bielefeld University, Germany from 2006 to 2012 to investigate violence against women as a challenge for global women rights. Currently, she is selected for International FAIMER Institute Fellowship from USA. Her research interests include gender-based violence, women's health in developing countries, maternal and child health, inequalities in health care utilization, health and human rights, and gender and development.

INSTITUTIONAL LINKAGES

PRC has established international linkages through membership with the **Population Association of Singapore (PAS)** on 11th January 22. Recently, PRC participated in PAS inaugural Annual General Meeting which was held on March 31st, 2022.

Population Association of Singapore (PAS) strives to provide a national platform for intellectual exchange and policy-relevant scientific research on population. The PAS mission is to promote the scientific study of the population, encourage exchange between researchers, and stimulate interest in population issues in Singapore and Asia.



PRC has also established linkages with the Population Welfare Department (PWD), Punjab.

The Population Welfare Department Punjab has outlined its goals as follows:

- Stabilize population growth
- Reduce fertility
- Facilitate and guide relevant sectors to achieve SDG objectives

The terms of collaboration between PRC and PWD are in process of finalization. However, the collaboration will initially lead to organizing joint events like Seminars, Webinars and Workshops.



WORKSHOP – STATA ONLINE COURSE FOR STUDENTS

PRC certification students took an online course introducing them to STATA. The course consisted of four modules as follows:

- Setting up and loading new data
- tracking calculations and data analysis
- Joining databases and course wrap-ups
- Course Assessment

The course consists of the basics of STATA software and will work as a prerequisite for upcoming workshop on univariate, bivariate and multivariate analysis.



OPEN HOUSE SESSION – CERTIFICATION PROGRAM IN DEMOGRAPHY AND POPULATION STUDIES

The Population Research Center (PRC) in collaboration with the Departments of Economics, Sociology, Statistics and Geography, has launched a Certification Program in "Demography and Population Studies" in fall'21. PRC is currently registering students for the 2nd batch of the certification program which will begin in fall'22. The certification program provides interdisciplinary understanding and training to undergraduate students in demographic theory, methods and analysis. Certification students are required to enroll for four courses which are all offered within one academic year (two semesters):

PRC organized an Open House Session on June 15th 2022 to inform students about the certification program which will commence in fall'22. The event started with a presentation by Dr. M. Vaqas Ali (Director, PRC) in which he explained the relevance and importance of the program followed by the presentations of the following four speakers:

After the detailed introductory session by Dr. M. Vaqas Ali, Dr. Hafiz Rizwan Ahmad from the department of economics described the importance of demography and how it relates to multiple economic indicators (scarcity, employment and resource generation etc.) to students majoring in economics. He also commented on demography and how it helps us to answer important and fundamental questions of economic literature.

After Dr. Rizwan's presentation, Professor Kashif Shafique from the department of Geography explained the association of geography and demography and how these two fields define population dynamics.





He added that population geography is one of the domains of human geography which studies composition, growth, distribution, migration movements. He also explained that the course which is being offered in certification program i.e., GEOG 220 is very relevant in terms of population and human geography.

Then, Dr. Anwar Mughal from the department of statistics shared that the certification program is an excellent integration of all subject areas. However, through the course Quantitative analysis (STAT 103), the students can use statistics tools i.e., SPSS and Excel on the population-related data. He also encouraged students to learn the softwares like R, STATA and can use them in their research. The certification program can be very beneficial for the students majoring in statistics because they can enhance the value of their qualification by adding this additional achievement.

Lastly, Dr. Jawad Tariq from the department of sociology explained the relevance and importance of the program in relation to the course SOCL 110. He explained that demography is the science of populations that examines the size and composition of population relationships between population composition and changes, dynamic life-course processes.

He also added that this program will help students to explore the difference among health & mortality, family change, migration, and migrants. At the conclusion of the open house, Ms. Zain Fatima Shamsi (Administrative Assistant, PRC) explained the registration process for 2nd batch of program.

Note Regarding Registration Process: Students can enroll for the courses included in the certification either by themselves through empower or by sending a request to the PRC. As there are no reserved seats for the certification students in the above mentioned courses, interested students are requested to enroll as soon as possible.
