

- Water security & Food security related to 2022 floods and possible solutions
- Public health issues related to 2022 floods and possible solu-

The prize distribution ceremony was held on 9th January 2023 from 3:00 – 4:00 PM in Executive lounge E-001. Top five students also presented their topics in the ceremony prior to the announcement of results.

Certificates and prizes among the participants were distributed by Dr. Jonathan Addleton (Rector, FCCU), PRC Advisory board members; Dr. Sufiyan Aslam (Associate vice Rector for Faculty Affairs), Dr. Gloria Calib (Associate vice Rector for Academic Affairs) and Dr. Kauser Abdulla Malik HI, SI, TI (HEC Distinguished Professor and Dean of Postgraduate Studies, Director ORIC).

The event ended with a note of thanks and tea.










PRC PUBLICATION 2023 "FLOODS 2022: ALL PAKISTAN PRC PANEL DISCUSSION AND STUDENT ESSAYS COMPETITION"

The event held in December 2022


The PRC organized and hosted a collaborative panel discussion on the "Devastation by Floods in Provinces: Relief and Rehabilitation activities & imminent challenges" on 9th December 2022, supported by UNFPA. This event was conducted in collaboration with the Population Council (PC), Pakistan, PRC, Institute of Business Administration (IBA), Karachi, PRC, University of Peshawar (UOP) and PRC, Baluchistan University of Information Technology, Engineering and Management Sciences (BUITEMS), supported by UNFPA.

The event consisted of two sessions. The first session focused on the relief and rehabilitation activities in the aftermath of the 2022 Floods at the national level. In which, Dr. G. M. Arif (President, Population Association of Pakistan -PAP) presented on how mismanagement of the government has led to unauthorized settlements in flood prone areas. He suggested that resilience policy is important to reduce existing risks and improve respond to new risks in Pakistan by empowering local governments and improving education and health facilities.


Secondly, Ms. Afia Salam (member of the National Climate Change Council) discussed of the impending challenges for Pakistan caused by the floods in 2022 and sustainable solutions. Ms. Afia discussed the Disaster Risk Management (DRM) and Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) of floods in Pakistan. She focused upon how Pakistan has multiple climate change threats which catalyzes in the heavy monsoon rainfalls. She also proposed that the population should be trained in basic survival skills to reduce disaster risk and rehabilitation and compensation should be given to the affected population.

Further, on provincial level, Ms. Maria Hassan (Assistant Professor, IBA, Karachi) discussed the devastation by floods in Sindh: Relief and rehabilitation activities in Sindh and imminent challenges. In addition, Mr. Mumtaz Ali (District Support Manager PPHI, District Pishin) discussed the devastation by floods in Baluchistan: Relief and rehabilitation activities in Baluchistan and imminent challenges.

In reference to this collaborative panel discussion (held on December 9th, 2022) and research essay competition (held in November 2022), PRC team has transcribed, edited, and finalized the presentations of the panelists and compiled the first ten student essays to be published in the form of the booklet (funded by ORIC, FCCU). The booklet proceedings have been transcribed, edited and finalized by the PRC team and proofread by two sources: Dr. Hafiz Rizwan Ahmed (Departmental Representative, PRC, Assistant Professor, Department of Economics) & the Writing center, FCCU. The publication of the booklet is available both in soft and hard form.

Crop loss due to flood 2022 in Pakistan



ABOUT THE GUEST SPEAKER

Prof. Dr. Muhammad Nizam Ud Din (S.I). is a renowned educationist and administrator and has been awarded the Sitara-e Imtiaz for his contribution in the field of education. He is the former chairman of the Higher Education Commission (HEC), Punjab and is currently serving as the Pro Rector and Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences, Superior University. He has also served as President, Population Association of Pakistan (PAP) and the Director of the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) in New York.

The event started with the recitations of the Holy Quran and Holy Bible followed by the welcome address by Dr. M. Vaqas Ali (Director, PRC) and presentation of the guest speaker (Prof. Dr. M. Nizam Ud Din).

During the seminar, Prof. Dr. Nizam Ud Din discussed the background and importance of the census stating, 'it is the process of collecting, compiling, evaluating, analyzing and publishing or otherwise disseminating demographic, economic and social data pertaining at a specified time, to all persons in a country'.

He shed light on the previous census of Pakistan and their critical importance followed by a comparative analysis of census in Pakistan and other countries like Iran, Egypt, Turkey, India and Bangladesh. He also explained the digitalization of the census and how there is a dire need to adopt latest technologies in Pakistan. Lastly, he explained the impact of digital censuses on elections where he talked about the way political polemics are settled, unprecedented level of accuracy and detail, computerized census and its less susceptible to manipulation and allowing for more informed decisions to be made.

The event ended with the discussion and Q/A session in which students and faculty members participated thoroughly followed by the presentation of souvenir to Prof. Dr. Muhammad Nizam Ud Din by Dr. Sikandar Hayat (Dean, Social Sciences).


PRC GAINED MEMBERSHIP OF
