Talk on Adjustment and Wellbeing of Older Adults in Old Age Homes

The Forman Sociological Society and the Department of Sociology hosted an online talk titled **“Adjustment and Wellbeing of Older Adults in Old Age Homes”**, led by Dr Jawad Tariq on July 25th 2022. Dr. Jawad discussed his published research on the neglected elderly population of Pakistan and how better policy can be planned for their housing, protection, and inclusion in society.

- Loneliness and adjustment problem in old age homes can be reduced by facilitating relationships of new residents with staff and well adjusted residents and encouraging the residents to engage in various activities at the facility
- Therapeutic interventions, such as Reminiscence therapy, and other individual as well as collective group discussions/sessions can help reduce loneliness and adjustment problems in addition to increasing social support available to residents of old age homes
- Preparation of a transitional care plan for the relocating older adults by comprehensive assessment of the individual as well as circumstances of relocation
- Increasing socio-recreational activities in the old age homes can lower loneliness, increase adjustment, and enhance wellbeing

Dr M. Vaqas Ali (Assistant Professor, Department of Sociology), as Director Population Research Center, has led efforts to organize or host the following activities to support colleagues, students, and research at FCCU overall:

- A collaborative panel discussion on the **"Devastation by Floods in Provinces: Relief and Rehabilitation activities & imminent challenges"** on 9th December 2022, supported by UNFPA.



Dr. Vaqas also served as a panelist at the 23rd Annual Population Research Conference organized by the Population Association of Pakistan, in a panel discussion on **"Population and Democracy: Pakistan unsolved dilemma of Social Cohesion"**. The topic of his presentation at the panel discussion was *"From a population to a nation: social cohesion as a key mediator between the welfare state and human development."*

Dr. Shamaila Athar (Assistant Professor, Department of Sociology) engaged her Criminology 118 class, in November 2022, by visiting the Safety and Security Office of FCCU headed by Colonel Khaqan Mahmood. Students gained valuable insights by taking a tour of how FCCU manages its security and how safety risk is mitigated on campus.

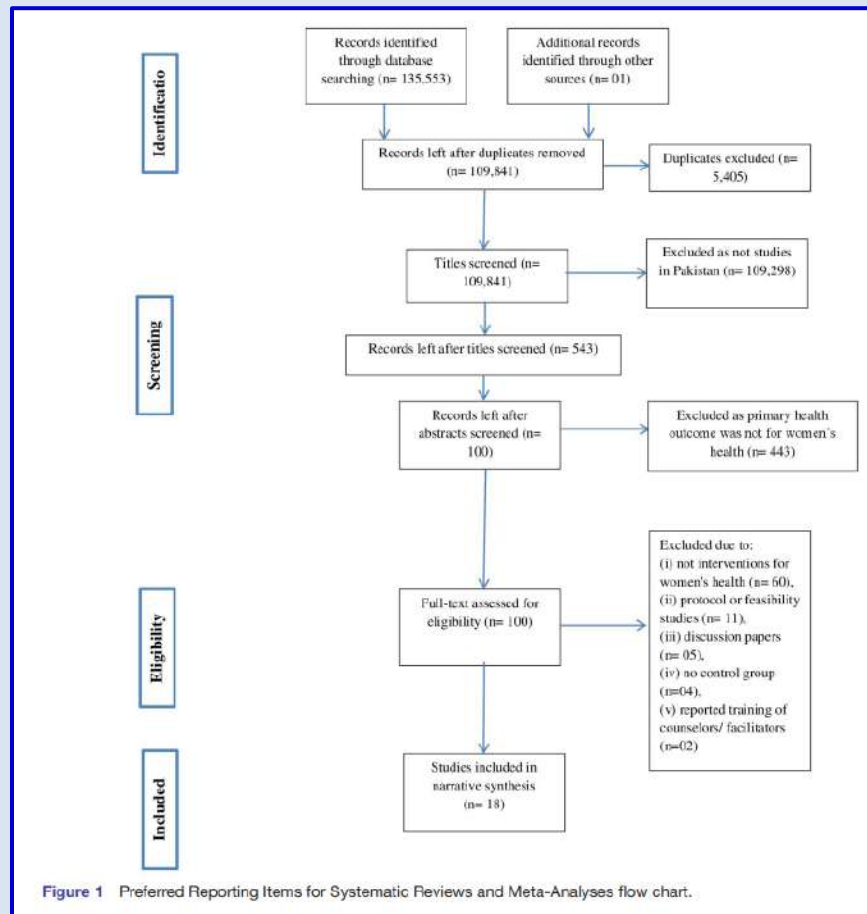


Dr. Sara Rizvi Jafree

Dr. Sara Rizvi Jafree (Associate Professor, Department of Sociology) completed the first part of her post-doctorate project, a systematic literature review of women's health outcomes from primary care interventions. The study has been published by BMJ Open and is open access to read: <https://bmjopen.bmj.com/content/bmjopen/12/8/e061644.full.pdf?with-ds=yes>

The review highlights that:

“There is an absence of information about the effectiveness of primary care services for older women, women with special needs, refugees and displaced women and unmarried women. Limited services delivered to women of reproductive years lack active door-to-door services, group-based approaches, and quality or holistic care. Facilitators that need more investment include: (i) utilization of community peers who can deliver care cost-effectively; (ii) e-health services to reach remote and home-based women; and (iii) integration of financial vouchers to support uptake in majority poor populations.”

Dr. Jawad Tariq

Dr Jawad Tariq (Assistant Professor, Department of Sociology) was selected for a five day course titled Digital and Computational Demography from November 14-18, 2022. The course was offered by Max Planck Institute for Demographic Research, Germany. The course was jointly instructed by Dr Emilio Zagheni, Dr. Aliakbar Akbaritabar, Dr. Jisu Kim, Dr. R Gordon Rinderknecht. And Dr. Tom Theile.

The topics covered in the course included:

- 1) Introduction to Digital and Computational Demography; Approaches for combining representative data and non-probabilistic samples; Identifying sources of bias in digital trace data and adjusting for them.
- 2) How internet works; Surfing the web and web scraping in R; Getting started on accessing APIs with R.
- 3) Using social media data for migration research; Accessing Twitter data via the Academic Twitter API.
- 4) Using large-scale bibliometric data for demographic research; Advantages and pitfalls of using Scopus data to trace internal and international scholarly migration worldwide.
- 5) The impact of digital technology on daily life and well-being, and on opportunities for primary data collection.

Dr Jawad successfully completed the course after taking an online exam conducted by MPIDR.

Ms. Shermeen Bano (Lecturer, Department of Sociology) presented her research paper, co-authored with Dr Rahla Rahat, Director National Centre for Resettlement and Rehabilitation at the University of the Punjab in November 2022, at the International Workshop on Climate Change, Displacement and Disease. The paper's title was **"Disaster Preparedness and Mitigation: Experiences and Reflections of the Survivors of 2022 floods in Baluchistan/Pakistan"**. The workshop was organized at Quaid-e-Azam University, Islamabad in partnership with the Edinburgh Centre for Medical Anthropology, University of Edinburgh.



Ms. Tehniyat Fatima

Ms. Tehniyat Fatima (Lecturer, Department of Sociology) presented the paper titled **"Adolescents' Notions and Experiences of Privacy in Vertical Living"** at the 4th Conference on Marginalized Populations arranged by the Sociology Department at FCCU. The paper is a part of her graduate research and highlights the importance of viewing age as a factor of marginalization in housing policy in Pakistan.

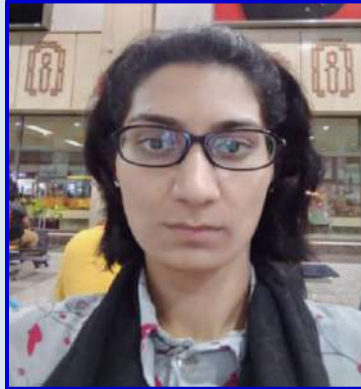
Amna Maryam
